George Mason University invites applications for a new, full-time, nine-month, term Assistant Professor of Social Work position, with an emphasis on social work practice. This position is a key component of a new initiative in faculty practice in the College of Health & Human Services. The College values clinical practice in order for faculty members to maintain and enhance the skills and knowledge needed for high quality instructional and research activities in social work and for interdisciplinary collaboration. This faculty position is designed to incorporate practice activities into the faculty member's teaching workload and to contribute a revenue stream to the College faculty practice plan. The type and amount of practice will be dependent upon the background and experiences of the successful candidate. We seek a talented and innovative scholar who is actively engaged in social work clinical practice and evidence-based practice.

Responsibilities: Faculty practice; teaching in the social work curriculum, including generalist and advanced clinical practice courses; BSW and MSW student advising; service.

Required Qualifications: Doctorate in Social Work or related field; MSW; and at least four years post-MSW practice experience. ABD candidates who anticipate completing the doctorate by the time of appointment will also be considered. Potential to be licensed in Virginia.

Desired Qualifications: Five or more years post-MSW experience. Clinical social work state licensure. Clinical and academic experiences with culturally diverse groups. Interest in developing and implementing curricula that address multicultural issues.

Salary: Salary is competitive, and based on experience and qualifications.
