Candidates for these positions will be expected to conduct research working within the Center for Social Work Practice and Policy Research, and collaborate with the Center director and staff.

The candidates for these positions must have an MSW degree, at least two years post-MSW practice experience, an earned doctorate in social work or a related

discipline, a good beginning record of publications and evidence of potential for outstanding scholarship; demonstrate strong potential as a teacher, mentor and scholar; demonstrate strong potential for external funding. Scholarly work focused on urban populations, particularly populations of color and urban poor and other vulnerable or oppressed populations. The candidates must show evidence of ability to conduct research independently and with others within social work and other disciplines and be capable of teaching and mentoring PhD students.

In addition, at the senior level must show evidence of substantial successful experience in social work education; outstanding scholarship and external funding to support his/her research and that of doctoral students; and evidence of serving as a chair or committee member of doctoral students' dissertation research. The candidates must show evidence of ability to conduct research independently and with others within social work and other disciplines. Demonstrated ability to garner external funding to support research.
